The McKinney-Vento Education Act, a federal law designed to address the educational needs of homeless students, is implemented in the state of Indiana to ensure that homeless children and youth have access to a Free and Appropriate Public Education (FAPE). Under this legislation, Indiana's school districts are required to remove barriers to enrollment, attendance, and academic success for homeless students.
